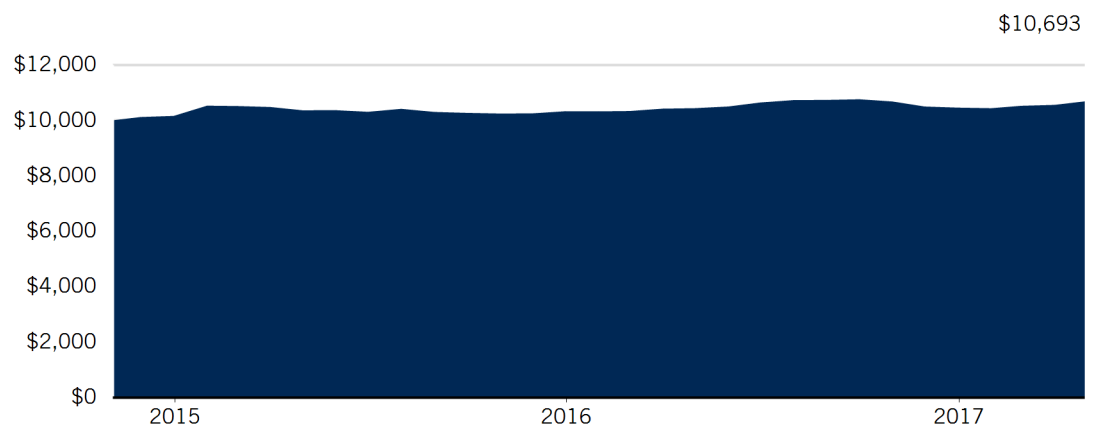

#### RISK PROFILE



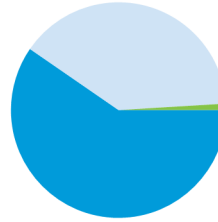
### GROWTH OF \$10,000 SINCE INCEPTION (C\$)
